Burglary Suspect

On May 5th Officers were dispatched to a burglary in progress at an apartment complex near 42nd and Shadeland. Dispatchers advised officers that two black males were kicking open a door to an apartment. Officers arrived on scene and located the two suspects fleeing the burglarized apartment. Officers chased the two suspects on foot throughout the apartment complex. Responding officers established a perimeter and canine arrived on scene to track and apprehend one of the burglary suspects hiding in an empty pool. The other suspect ran by a police officer who was on the perimeter. The officer was able to make apprehension of that suspect after a short struggle. Both of the suspects were arrested for felony burglary, felony theft, and misdemeanor resisting law enforcement.

Hoosier Neighbor?

Why is it important to know your neighbors address? I'm sure there are many reasons it could come into play but for law enforcement purposes it is important. 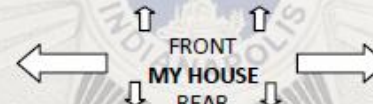

MAJOR INCIDENTS/ARRESTS

DP120061195 – Aggravated Assault/Knife – 4700 Munter Lane ND22 - Officers were dispatched on a report of a person stabbed. Upon arrival the victim and suspect were both on scene. The victim stated he was giving the suspect a tattoo and she did not like the color. The suspect then began to hit and punch the victim. The suspect then took a knife and began to stab the victim and block his exit. The victim was able to leave and call the police. The suspect was arrested.

DP120062761 – Recovered Stolen Vehicle - 3700 Whenner Drive ND33 – A district officer was behind the suspect vehicle. After checking the license plate it returned as being stolen. The officer caught up to the vehicle just in time to see the vehicle stop and four black male's exited and fled from the vehicle. The officer immediately called for additional units. After a brief canvas of the area one of the four suspects was apprehended and identified by initiating officer as a back seat passenger. The driver, later identified returned to the scene voluntarily and gave himself up to the officers. The suspect driving the vehicle was arrested for vehicle theft and resisting law enforcement. The passenger was arrested for joy riding and resisting law enforcement.

SUMMARY OF VIOLENT CRIMES W/ PHYSICAL INJURY

DP120062893 – Aggravated Assault Gun – 8600 Rhone Terrace ND61 - Officers were dispatched to the report of a person shot. Upon arriving, officers located white male victim with gunshot wounds to his chest and arm, and his ex-wife was near him. She alleges that she shot her ex-husband after he roughed her up and while he was pinning her down on the couch. The victim was transported to the hospital. Domestic Violence and Homicide Detectives responded to the scene and conducted the investigation.

DP120061330 – Aggravated Assault/Gun – 3200 Ruckle Street ND11 - Officers were dispatched to the hospital on a report of a person shot. Witnesses stated the victim was gambling with the suspect. The suspect put a gun to the head of the victim. A fight ensued between the two. The gun went off and the victim was struck in the arm. Aggravated assault detective was on the scene.

DP120062971 – Rape – 3600 East 39th Street ND21 - Officers were dispatched to the report of a nude female in the hallway stating that she had been raped. Upon arriving, officers located the

victim. The victim stated that she arrived at the residence with her mother on 5/9/2012 shortly after midnight. The victim stated that her mother left. The suspect is the resident of the apartment. The victim stated that she asked the suspect if she could use his phone. The victim stated that the suspect told her to use the phone in his bedroom. The victim stated that when she went in his room, he pushed her on the bed, punched, choked, sexually assaulted, and raped her. The victim stated that the suspect let her exit the room to use the restroom. The victim stated she fled the apartment at that time. The suspect and a crime scene were located in the residence. Sex Crimes responded to the scene.

DP120062400 – Injured Officer – 900 Park Central Drive South ND74 – A District officer was investigating a disturbance. While trying to arrest and place a subject in handcuffs, The subject intentionally elbowed the officer in the mouth before fleeing. The subject was apprehended and arrested under case #DP120062395 and cad #I121290240. The officer had very minor swelling to his upper lip and did not want or need medical attention. Photos were taken of the officer’s injury.
