Man sentenced to 20 years for Attempted Murder of IMPD Officer

Kennic Brown pleaded guilty to 2015 shooting

(Indianapolis, Ind.) Marion County Prosecutor Terry Curry announced today that Kennic Brown was sentenced on Monday to 20 years in the Indiana Department of Correction for shooting a firearm at an Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department (IMPD) officer. Brown pleaded guilty earlier this month to Attempted Murder (Level 1 Felony) for the December 22, 2015, incident.

Prior to the shooting, Brown led IMPD officers on a nine-minute, high-speed chase and crashed the vehicle he was driving into a home on the southeast side of Indianapolis near South Keystone Avenue and East Minnesota Street. As the IMPD officer pulled his vehicle behind the crashed vehicle, Brown fired nine gunshots out of the back window of his vehicle in the direction of the officer. One of the bullets struck the side of the officer's police vehicle and others struck nearby homes.
