### **Stop the Violence, Inc.**

Stop the Violence Indianapolis, Inc., is a catalyst for social change – empowering people to take action to ensure safety, justice, accountability and healing for people. The nonprofit organization is dedicated to preventing violence by changing hearts and minds.

### **Hawthorne Community Center**

Hawthorne Community is a non-profit community center that is proud to have served Indianapolis' near Westside for over 85 years.

### **Forest Manor Multi-Service Center**

Programming focuses on educating, empowering and encouraging youth through workshops, tutoring, life skills training, discussion groups, guest speakers, community service and recreational activities. Forest Manor's focus is to prevent youth violence by expanding our current crime prevention programming by incorporating the Four Goals to Prevent Youth Violence from the successful Minneapolis Youth Violence Prevention plan.

### **Young Men, Inc.**

The Young Men, Inc. Male Empowerment Program addresses the myriad of problems that Black and other at-risk males face today. Its purpose is to foster an attitude of achievement in these young men by providing them the knowledge and skills necessary to make better choices and decisions in life that help give them a more positive direction in life.

### **Ten Point Coalition**

Ten Point Coalition has created weekend Faith Patrol teams to work with its Street Outreach Works to patrol in high crime areas on Friday and Saturday nights. Ten Point deploys team members with the five highest crime areas correlated by zip codes.

### **Outreach, Inc.**

Outreach equips and empowers homeless teens and young adults to achieve stability and life transformation. Outreach used min-grant funding to expand its Resource Coordination Program to include greater engagement of the Mental Health Counseling Program.

### **100 Black Men**

100 Black Men of Indianapolis, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) youth development organization that was founded in 1984 and serves more than 700 Indianapolis youth each year through mentoring-based educational programs. Its mission is "Black men giving real time to positively impact the development of youth in our communities."

## **New Life Development Ministries**

New Life Development Ministries' primary objective is to train and employ former offenders. Its mission is to hire 200 ex-offenders by creating jobs and starting businesses that New Life Development Ministries (NLDM) would own and operate such as consignment shops, barber shops, construction companies, etc.

## **Clean for Green**

Started in the summer of 2012, the goal of Clean for Green was to give Far Eastside youth a positive opportunity to make money over the summer months. Recognizing the large amount of debris and trash in the community, FEAC engaged young people ages 14-18 to clean up trash in our community and be paid.

## **Destiny Live Center**

Destiny is dedicated to providing a comprehensive musical learning experience for young people, pre-kindergarten through high school.

## **Mt. Moriah Teen Night**

Mt. Moriah Teen Night at the Mount is organized as a positive and fun alternative for the youth in the community ages 8-19 every Friday night from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Teen Night at the Mount offers activities including but not limited to basketball, video games, music, pool, arts and crafts, a nail room and more.
