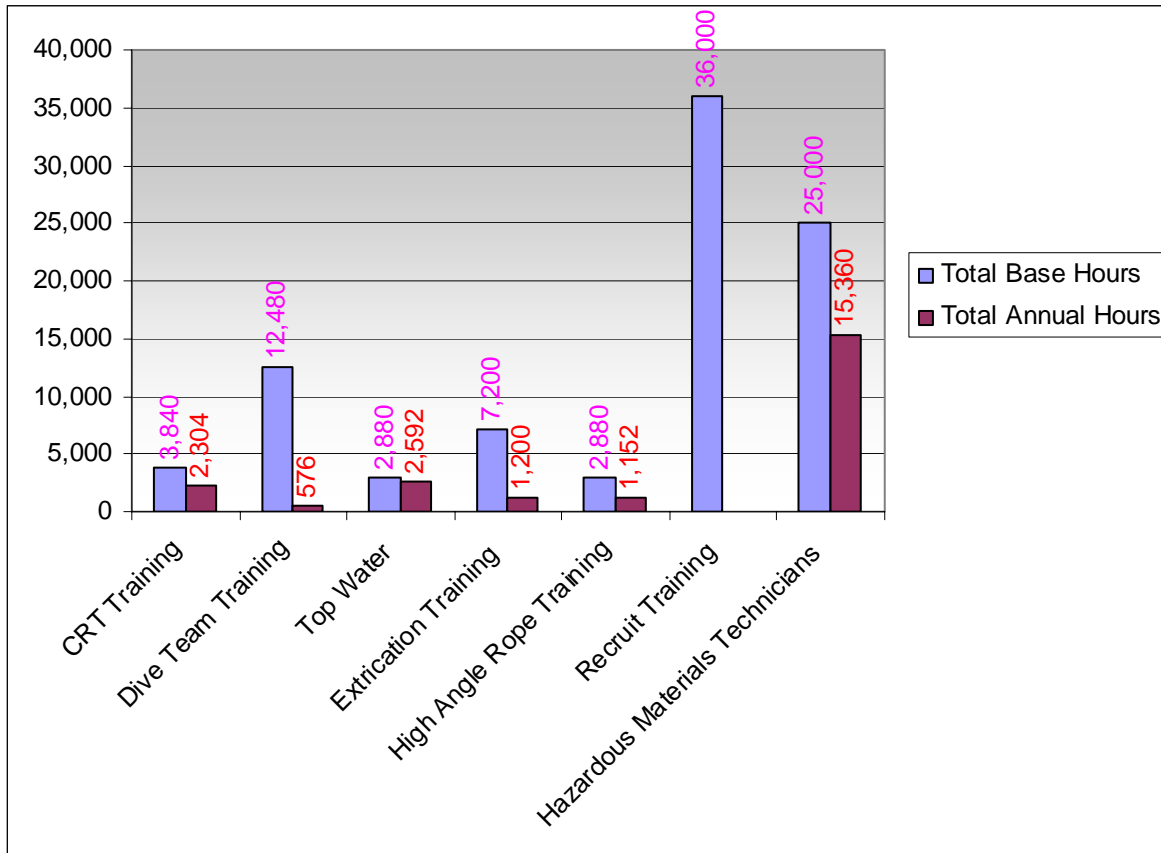

Training Hours

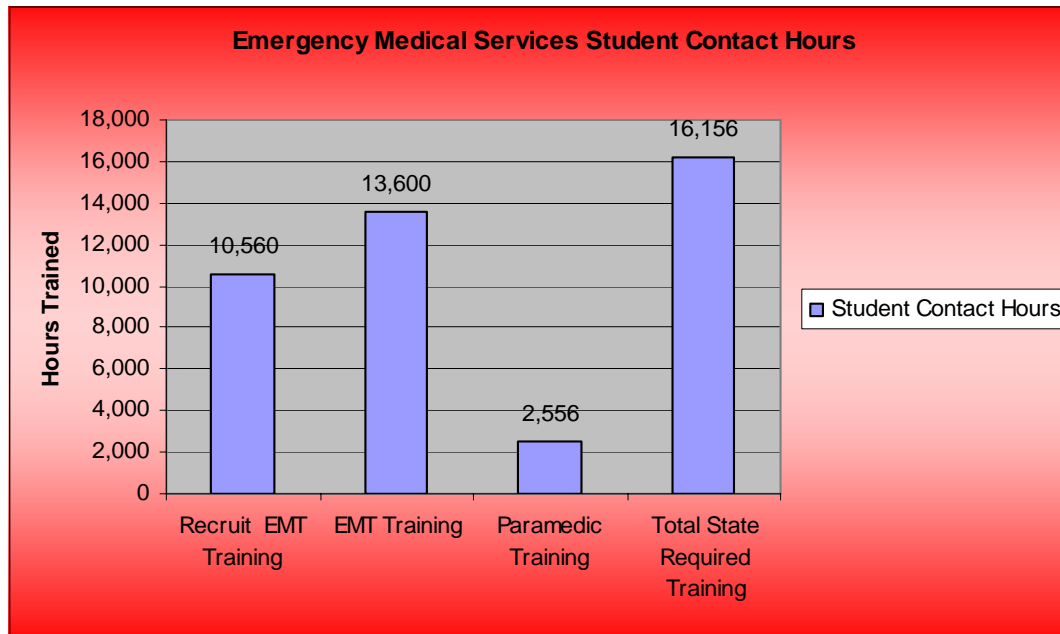

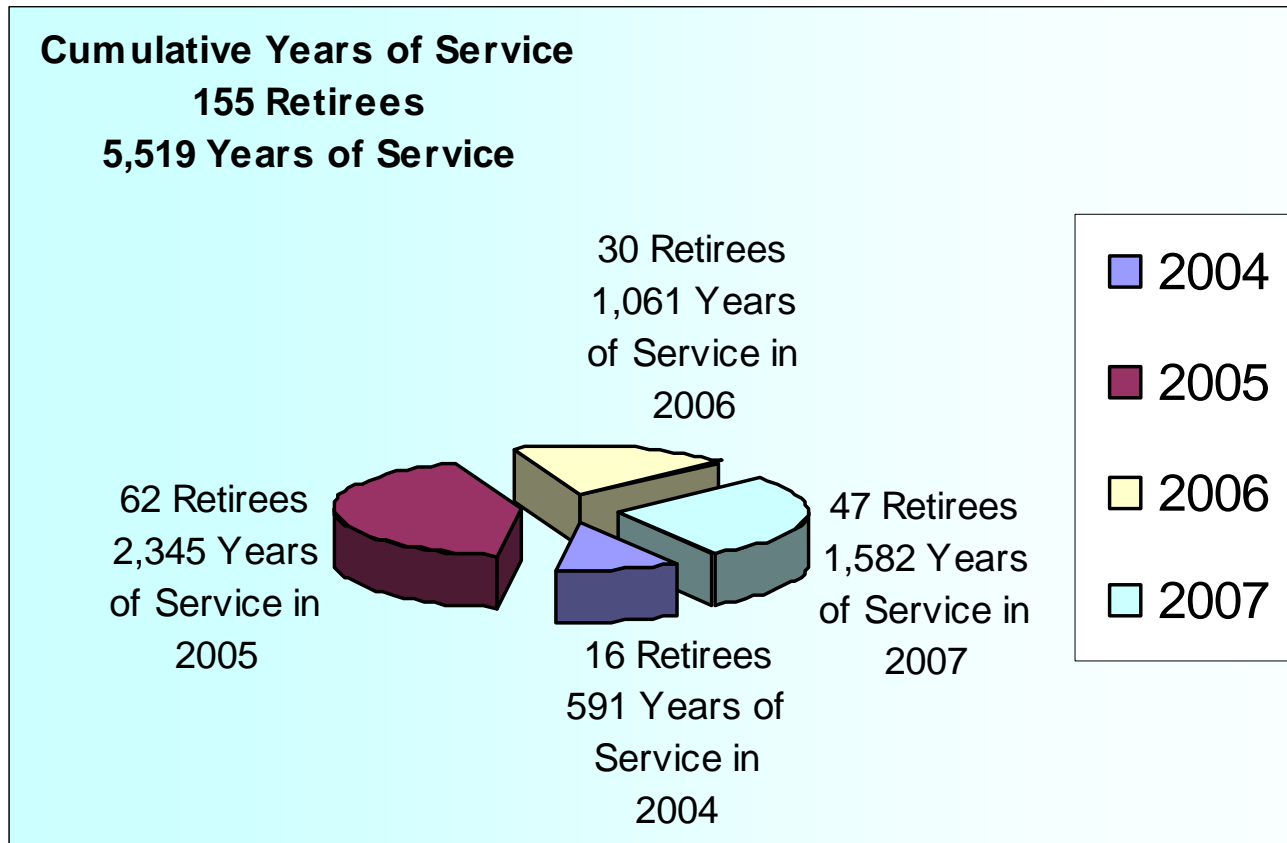

FIREFIGHTER SAFETY



- National Firefighter Near-Miss Reporting System
 - Indianapolis is one of 30 departments developing this system
 - Program will be delivered nationally beginning September, 2005
- Unsafe Buildings Program
 - Collaborative effort between Safety Office, Health & Hospital Corp., and Fire Prevention Office.
 - Identifies unsafe buildings that will result in greater safety for public and firefighters.
- Work Performance Evaluation
 - Validated job-skills performance test
 - Measures a firefighter's ability to perform the minimum tasks required on the fire ground.
