PROJECT DETAILS

East 38th Street is a heavily traveled major thoroughfare, and has experienced severe deterioration due to drainage issues, and years of wear and tear.

Plans to repair 38th Street, from Emerson Avenue to Arlington Avenue, include the removal of old pavement through milling, base repairs, drainage improvements, and resurfacing. This project received funding from the Community Crossings Grant which covered 50% of the cost, and the additional cost will come from local funding.
