There will be a meeting of the Public Works Committee of the City-County Council on **Tuesday, May 28, 2013** at **5:00 p.m.** in **Room 260** of the City-County Building. It is anticipated that the following items may be considered by the Committee:

PROPOSAL NO. 142, 2013 - amends the Code to provide for required water conservation measures when a water alert, warning or emergency has been declared

PROPOSAL NO. 141, 2013 - amends the Code to allow monies from the RebuildIndy Fund to be appropriated to the Department of Public Safety for the purpose of reimbursing the department for the expenses relating to the recruitment, hiring and training of sworn police officers and to create a new non-reverting police recruiting fund

PROPOSAL NO. 88, 2013 - establishes an interest in acquiring real estate owned by Deborah M. Bilal for the construction of the 71st Street Bikeway project

PROPOSAL NO. 85, 2013 - authorizes parking restrictions on Pennsylvania Street from 48th to 49th Street (District 8)

PROPOSAL NO. 109, 2013 - authorizes intersection controls in the New Augusta Woods subdivision (District 1)

PROPOSAL NO. 110, 2013 - authorizes intersection controls at Brookside Parkway North Drive and 19th Street (District 10)

PROPOSAL NO. 111, 2013 - authorizes parking restrictions on 52nd Street between Sunset and Byram Avenues (District 8)

PROPOSAL NO. 112, 2013 - authorizes intersection controls at McFarland Boulevard and Tarragon Place (District 24)

PROPOSAL NO. 114, 2013 - authorizes parking restrictions on Founders and Wesleyan Roads near DePauw Boulevard (District 1)

PROPOSAL NO. 138, 2013 - approves an increase of \$350,000 in the 2013 Budget of the Department of Public Works (Redevelopment General Fund) to fund Phase One of the Gateway, Pedestrian and Transit Improvements Project in the Lafayette Square area

PROPOSAL NO. 139, 2013 - authorizes parking restrictions on the south side of St. Joseph Street between Emerson Avenue and Leland Avenue (District 17)

PROPOSAL NO. 140, 2013 - authorizes intersection controls at 11th Street and Downey Avenue (District 17)
