Once again, Indiana voters are ready to make their mark on national, state and local politics during our 2016 elections. In preparation for what could be record high turnout, our office wants to make sure you know what to do if you or a voter needs help.

Indiana citizens can file complaints with the Secretary of State's office regarding polling place accessibility or any concerns regarding possible fraudulent activities on or leading up to Election Day. Hoosiers may make contact by calling the toll-free number at 1-866-IN1-VOTE (1-866-461-8683). Secretary of State staff are on hand during business hours, 8:00 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Monday- Friday as well as 6:00 a.m. to 7 p.m. Eastern Time on Election Day.

Hoosiers may also complete the Indiana Voter Fraud and Accessibility Grievance affidavit form, which is located on the Secretary of State website at <http://www.in.gov/sos/elections/2653.htm>. Those who submit this form are advised to have it notarized in order to assist investigators and prosecutors, before filing it with the Secretary of State's office.

The Secretary of State's office will also be implementing an Election Day Response Team. Several Special Secretary of State Deputies will be appointed for the purpose of responding to any election related issues, spot-checking polling locations for accessibility and integrity in the process. If you believe there is an issue and want to notify the special deputies serving on the response team, please contact 1-866-IN1-VOTE (1-866-461-8683).
